# REPORT on Disaster Management Training Workshop

Date: 17/02/2018

Disaster Management Training Workshop was held on 16th and 17th February, 2018. Vice Principal (Arts) Khan Moinuddin inaugurated the workshop.

On February 16, Dr. Anil Dandekar provided guidance on various disasters and necessary training to prevent them. Dr. Ajay Kulkarni gave a demonstration on first aid during a disaster. Dr. Asif Ahmed provided guidance on the role of 108 services and ambulance services during disasters.

Dr. Sajid Hundekar presented a film show on disaster management. The workshop was moderated by Dr. Bhavana Deshpande and Akbar Syed.

On February 17, 2018, Dr. Ayesha Fatima provided first aid during the disaster, fire officer Shri P. G. Hasbe and Mr. Suresh Sagvekar imparted training on firefighting rescue operations during disasters. ### DESCRIPTIVE REPORT ON TREE PLANTATION DRIVE IN THE ADOPTED VILLAGE

The National Service Scheme Cell of Poona College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Camp, Pune organized a *Tree Plantation Drive* in its adopted village Bopgaon (Tq. Purandar, Dist. Pune) with the cordial help and enthusiastic support from the members of Bopgaon Panchayat Board and the villagers.

The drive was the brainchild of Dr. Aftab Anwar Shaikh, Principal of the college who wished to plant 100 seedlings in Bopgaon on the very first day (01st July) of the *Tree Plantation Week* in presence of Dr. V. R. More, the Joint Director, Directorate of Higher Education, Pune at the hands of whom seedlings were planted in the college campus on the day. Thus was made the tryst with Tree Plantation in Bopgaon on 05<sup>th</sup> July 2017.

The NSS wing, under the chaperonage of Mr. Zameer Sayyed and Mrs. Swaleha Mulla, the NSS Programme Officers, set out to bring Bopgaon villagers under a canopy of *Save Trees, Save Earth*, an awareness campaign bewaring the onlookers of environment degradation and bewitching off-track people, apathetic to Nature, to volunteer guardianship of the 100 seedlings planted in their village.

45 volunteers under the supervision of 06 staff members planted 100 seedlings which include *Chinch, Aawala, Jaambhal* 20 plants each and *Mohogani, Moha, Spatodiya* and *Adulsa* 10 plants each. The plants were selected by Dr. Ilyas Sayyed and Mr. Zameer Sayyed taking into consideration the trees that will give fruits, shed and medicinal benefit.

### DESCRIPTIVE REPORT ON INTENSIVE CLEANLINESS DRIVE THROUGH STREET PLAY AND *SHRAMDAN*

The NSS Wing of Poona College organized this drive to observe *Swachhata Abhiyan Pandharwada* in order to actualize the vision of *Clean India, Healthy India*. This time was taken into consideration the historical significance and the sanctity of historical monuments or forts. Our NSS cell chose a historical place under the influence of a guiding principle that the unique evidence of our glorious past should not be irreparably damaged or ruined aesthetically due to our inappropriate behaviour.

#### Why Sinhagad Fort?

Sinhagad Fort is one such a monument to be proud of. It is 37km away from Pune. Other historical places such as Aga Khan Palace, Shanivar Waada are hold abreast of Pune city and enjoy the service of salaried employees who maintain cleanliness in and around it. People can behave differently depending on the types of place and situation. They become apprehensive about their improper disposal behaviour if the place is populated or under surveillance. The same people leave behind a mess if assured that their irresponsible behaviour goes unnoticed. The Sinhagad Fort remains such a place where the tourist hubs take liberty and litter the place unabashedly. Boxes of packed lunch are passed around, devoured by tourists sitting in the bus and then tossed out of the window leaving behind a pile of mess. Consequently, the parking lots and the shops-premises installed inside and outside the gates get filthier.

Cleanliness is not just behaviour. It is an attitude. Any NSS Cell works to build up a mindset which will choose what is right over what is easy or

convenient. And so, our crew visited the fort and there our volunteers performed a nukkad-naatak (Street Play) entitled *Kachron Ke Khiladi: A Story of Kharaate Kids* in a chowk of the village and in a Zilha Parishad School amidst the houses and populated site.

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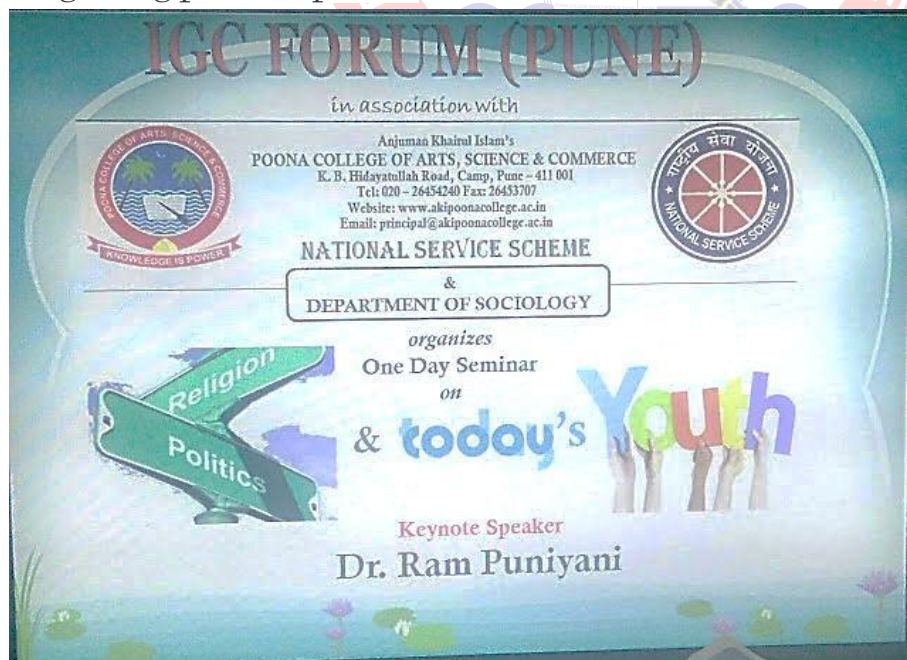

Dr. Dhangekar, Medical Officer and Mr. Mujeeb Shaikh, Laboratory Technician, along with the support staff conducted the drive smoothly successfully. The site of the Kanhe Railway Station populated with the passengers, vendors and pedestrians was taken up for cleanliness drive. The place and path were made hygienic and pro-health. Even the schools premises and roadside area was cleaned up before the large number of bystanders gaining vigour and wisdom to maintain cleanliness. The Kanhe Group Grampanchayat happy due to successful conduction of need-based projects issued a letter of appreciation and gratefulness in the name of Principal of the college acknowledging the 'difference' the campers made in the lifestyle of the villagers.</p>

### **SEVEN DAY SPECIAL WINTER CAMP AT KANHE VILLAGE**

The NSS wing of Poona College of Arts, Science and Commerce organized its Seven Day Special Winter Camp in its adopted village Kanhe (Tq. Maval, Dist. Pune) from 16<sup>th</sup> of December 2017 to 22<sup>nd</sup> of December 2017 under the able guidance of Dr. Aftab Anwar Shaikh, Principal of the college and Vice Principals Mr. Moinuddin Khan and Mr. Iqbal Shaikh. The camp was put into operation under the Prime Minister Narendrajī Modi's Swachh Bharat, Swasth Bharat initiative to give impetus to the vision and mission explained and exposed to by Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

#### **✚ AADHAR Enrolment & Voter ID Registration Drive:**

The NSS volunteers visiting the villagers door-to-door under a mass-sensitization drive on cleanliness came across with a section of society completely unaware and illiterate of government schemes and basic facilities/necessities like AADHAR card, voter ID. The volunteers were shocked after realizing that a whole community had been the residents of the village for years but were outside the mainstream. Mr. Rajendra Satkar, Kanhe Grampanchayat member, made all of us acquainted with this tribal community known as *Katkari Samaaj* and seconded our proposal to undertake AADHAR Enrolment Drive exclusively for this faction of Kanhe-villagers.

The whole set up was prepared in collaboration with Deputy Collector, Pune in the ZP School, Kanhe for AADHAR Enrolment Process with finger-prints and

photograph. Thirty-nine *Katkari* villagers, in presence of Mrs. Rajashri Satkar, Sarpanch of the village and Grampanchayat members, completed the process of enrolment. Sixty applications for voter ID were also processed with required documents at times from Grampanchayat which has created its own support system for the successful conduction of the drive. Mrs. Swaleha Mulla, the NSS Programme Officer, was instrumental in its successful conduction.

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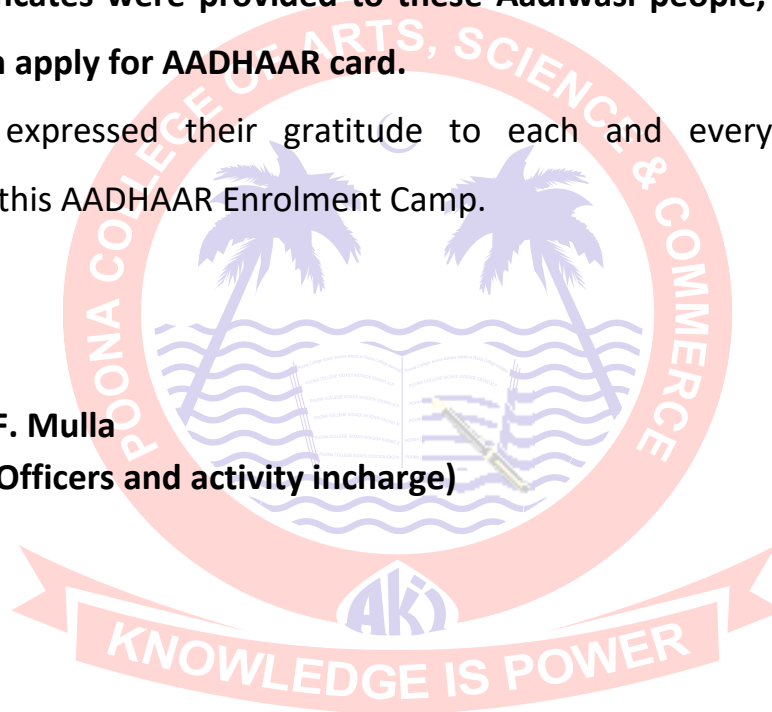
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NSS Volunteers were trained to counsel and fill-up the AADHAAR Enrolment Forms.

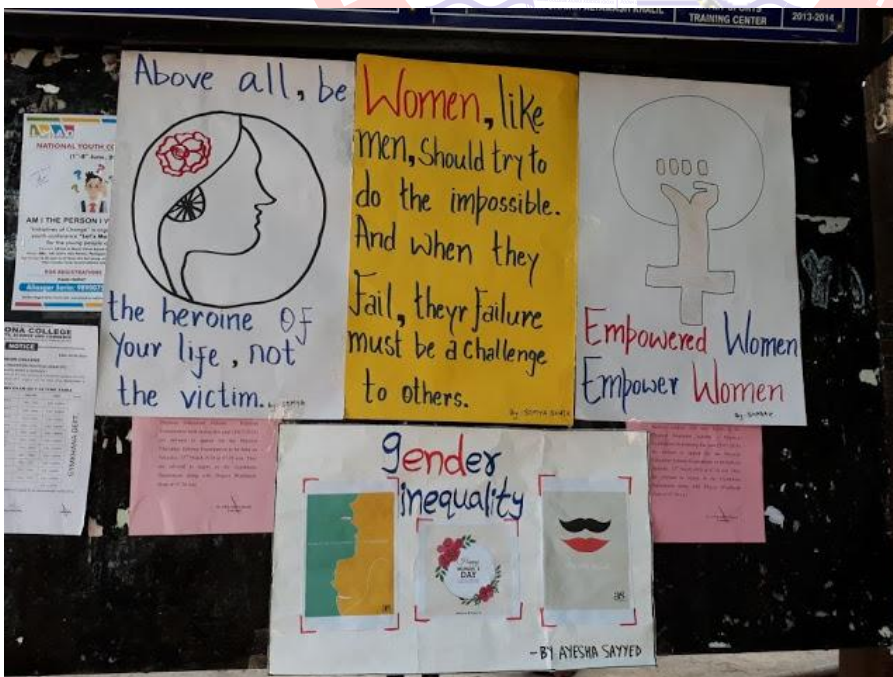

### DESCRIPTIVE REPORT ON

### SWACHHA BHARAT SUMMER INTERNSHIP

This internship aimed at 100 hour experiential internship programme that required the candidate to visit a village and conduct activities of their choice to contribute to the cause of rural sanitation in India. The objective of this internship programme was to engage the youth across the country and develop their skill for sanitation-related work, amplify mass-awareness on cleanliness and cement the people's movement with the aspect of *Swachh Bharat Mission*. This is in line with the Prime Minister Narendrajii Modi's call on October 2, 2014 for each individual to devote 100 hours to Swachhata throughout the year. The NSS wing of Poona College had successfully completed the 10 Day camp under Swachh Bharat Summer Internship from 20<sup>th</sup> June 2018 to 29<sup>th</sup> June 2018 at its adopted village Kanhe (Tq. Maval, Dist. Pune). Dr. Aftab Anwar Shaikh, Principal of the college, has been the backbone of the NSS Cell standing firm to support the NSS crew on mission under the chaperonage of Mr. Zameer Sayyed, the NSS Programme Officer. Mr. Chandgude provided the accommodation in Sai Seva Dham. Mr. Rajendra Satkar, the Kanhe Group-Grampanchayat Member, with the kind support from the village-sarpanch Mrs. Rajashree Satkar, had been a helping hand to look after the campers during the stay. The Grampanchayat members, senior citizens and the villagers of Kanhe village were overjoyed to see the overall result of the NSS work.

The volunteers formed a team and named it as *Dahaad* which means *roar of lion* if understood literally. In this context, it represented 16 *Swachhata-sainik* who roared for the cleanliness of the village – the ones who roared against the dirt.

Team *Dahaad* carried several activities during the camp to:

✚ Inform, Educate, Engage, Involve, Empower and Initiate

All the volunteers hustled hard to achieve the aforementioned objectives by executing following projects:

#### 1) AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS:

In order to aware people about dumping of garbage straight into bins and not on streets or surrounding areas, the volunteers reached out to the houses of people to inform and aware them about the daily waste-collection and waste-management. The team endeavored to reach about 130-150 houses just in day. Apart from verbal awareness, the team also created awareness in a very attractive and effective manner by accompanying the tractor to collect garbage from every house of each ward. The tractor was rallied in every lane playing folksongs such as *Gaadiwaala aaya ghar se kachra nikaal* to attract the attention of the family-members and to refrain them from disowning their responsibility to look after cleanliness in and around their homes. The activity prolonged for about 09 hours a day.

#### 2) DUSTBIN INSTALLATION:

Under this activity, 10 dustbins were installed in the entire village. The dustbin had two containers one for wet waste and the other for dry waste. The dustbins were provided to the NSS Unit by APCC i.e. Adar Poonawala Clean City Limited. Wherein the volunteers approached the CEO of the APCC and asked them to provide dustbins so as to use them in the village for the welfare of the villagers. Dustbins were place in different areas on different spots and people of houses of surrounding areas were awared to dump the waste in placed dustbins only. Total time spent for this activity was about 6 hours a day.

#### 3) CLEANING OF DUMPS CLEANING OF DUMPS CLEANING OF DUMPS:

Apart from installation of dustbins, the 'public created dumps' were cleaned by the students themselves before installing the dustbins. Every street where garbage was collected and thrown on a daily basis was cleaned by students hands and was then put into tractor and taken forward. Not just cleaning but also awareness during the cleaning process went on the surroundings to notify people about dustbin installation and garbage management. Every house nearby was informed to put their waste into dustbins. Posters regarding waste management were also placed at the 'self-created dumping places'. The activity carried out for about 8-9 hours.

#### 4) NUKKAD NATAK/ STREET 2. NUKKAD NATAK/ STREET NUKKAD NATAK/ STREETPLAYS:

A street play entitled "KACHRYAANE KELA KACHRA" was performed before the students and staff of ZILLA PARISHAD School, Kanhe. The play displayed originality of people's behavior regarding waste management and its

solutions. Viewers appreciated and responded with great enthusiasm. A short question-answer session was conducted after the street play and the answerers were presented small goodies. Later, a dance was performed by the volunteers on the song related to the theme 'Swachhata'. To make the sensitization more effective and networking, a drawing competition was announced amongst the 600 school children from class 1st to 7th on the theme 'My contribution towards Swachhata Abhiyan'. The First three rankers were awarded with 1000/-, 700/- and 500/- Rs respectively. Students' parents were also made aware about swachhata when assembled to pick up their children. Of about 98-100 posters were collected from the school. Total time utilized for the activity was about 6 hours.

#### 5) DOOR-TO-DOOR VISITS:

Door-To-Door visit was done in a pair of two all over the village. During the visit villagers were asked a few questions regarding waste management. Questions were about 'How did people collect their waste?', 'Where did they throw it after the collection?', 'Did they segregate their waste?', 'In what places they dumped their waste?'. Their answers were video-recorded and they were informed about the waste collecting moving round the village every day and a little information about segregation of dry and wet waste was given to people thereafter. Houses of 5 to 7 wards were covered during the visit. This activity utilized 8 hours of that day. In this activity we received both positive and negative reviews about segregating the waste. And we became successful in spreading awareness in the minds of the villagers about waste management.

#### 6) CONDUCTING SCHOOL LEVEL RALLIES:

In order to spread awareness about cleanliness and segregation of waste into wet and dry, a rally with school children was conducted. Rally focused on spreading the message of *Swaccha Kanhe Sundar Kanhe*. Students from ZILLA PARISHAD SCHOOL, KANHE, participated in the rally. Near about 130 students out of 571 of total students participated in the rally and helped to achieve the goal. Students carried musical instruments to make the rally more effective and attractive. Of about 50-60 families were aware about the rally and its purpose. The rally carried over for about 5 hours.

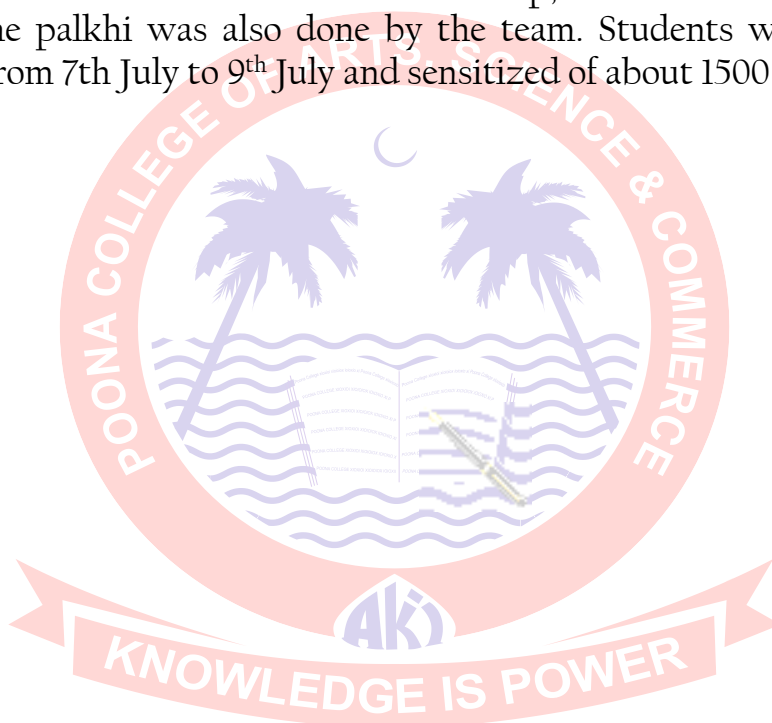
#### 7) WALL PAINTINGS:

Wall painting was the best way to attract the people to make them aware. So, the volunteers used this method for spreading awareness about the cleanliness drive. They had painted walls of ZILLA PARISHAD School, KANHE which indicated cleanliness with the tagline of *SWACHHATA HI SOY AAHE MHANUN NAHITAR SAWAY AAHE MHANUN* and the other one was representing the "CLEAN INDIA". All team members took very hard efforts to paint these walls in heavy rain with

passion. In 8 hours only this activity was done by the volunteers and many villagers were sensitized by this work and many will be sensitized from this day for sure.

#### 8) OTHER ACTIVITY:

*Swachha Nirmal Dindi.* This team of Poona College also contributed with their efforts during the Palkhi. The team helped to aware people about the anti-plastic, anti-thermocool movement and requests the devotees to use patrawali. Students also requested for a Nirmal wari meaning, requesting the devotees to use toilets. The team worked, sensitized and ensured all the cleanliness and discipline. Team also performed a street play sensitizing on the waste management during the palkhi. These activities were all conducted in the school named, MAHARSHI HARKADAS PRATHAMIK VIDYALAY in Camp, Pune. Cleaning of the areas surrounding the palkhi was also done by the team. Students worked 25 hours within 3 days from 7th July to 9<sup>th</sup> July and sensitized of about 1500 devotees.

### Report

The Department of Sociology of Y&M AKI's Poona College of Arts, Science and Commerce has organized one day Workshop on "Paper bag making". It was attended by 293 students and along with some international students from diverse disciplines, across the all the departments. The workshop begin with the welcome address by the Principal of Poona College – Dr. Aftab Anwar Shaikh. He welcomed all the individuals who had join and learn the new skills. The workshop had some objectives which were discussed by Dr. Gulab Pathan, the workshop secretary. He told the major environmental issues emerging in today's world. He started from explaining the pros and cons of because of plastics to wishing luck to all for their future endeavors. The purpose of this programme was to make the students aware about paper bag. This programme begin with introduction by Dr. Gulab Pathan, head department of sociology, who started with the presentations.

Plastic, although considered as one of the greatest inventions by virtue of its use in carrying things has become a major element in polluting the environment. It is almost impossible to destroy plastic bags. Plastic bags remain in the soil for centuries, defiling the soil, preventing it from replenishing its nutrients, and rendering to barren. This ultimately results in fertile land becoming barren and turning into desert. It is estimated that the life expectancy of plastic bags is around 250 years. Paper bags on the other hand, come from wood, which comes from trees, which grow in the earth's soil. The trees needed to make paper bags are considered renewable resources. That means more trees can be planted to fulfill the gap of trees that are cut down to make paper and other products. Once paper is

made, it can be recycled and used to create more paper goods. Bags made from paper are bio-degradable and hence highly environment friendly than plastic bags, which pose a threat to the environment. Many State Governments have imposed or going to impose a ban on thin plastic carry bags and is likely to extend it to all the plastic carry bags, since they are bound to create health hazards. Eco-friendly paper carry bag is the only alternative. Since there is lot of demand, paper bag making will certainly be a provider of self-employment.

We need small size bags every day for various purposes like grocery, fruits, and vegetables. We use plastic bags for such purposes. Plastic shopping bags have a surprisingly significant environmental impact for something so seemingly innocuous. Plastic shopping bags kill large numbers of wildlife each year. One of the most dramatic impacts is on marine life. So to avoid above harmful effects of Plastic Bags, viable alternative is required which is Paper Bag. Actually, Paper Bag is being used but in very small scale. Conventional Paper Bags require special paper which increases the overall cost of the Paper Bag. This is the main cause due to which use of Paper Bag is less. Also initial investment cost is very much in conventional Paper Bag Machine. So it cannot be used for small scale production. All these problems are eliminated in the presented machine. A machine whose initial cost is less, which does not require any special paper, which can be used for small scale production, is developed. This machine will help a poor family to earn money through small scale production of paper bags.

The programme was a huge success; it was a day of splendor where everything that was gathered from the audience and everyone else in the hall was extravagant and complete wisdom. We observe the satisfaction on the face of the students.
